STAKES Shakertown S. Grade 3 - Thoroughbred

FOR THREE YEAR OLDS AND UPWARD. By subscription of \$100 each, which should accompany the nomination or by Supplementary Nomination of \$5,000 at time of entry (includes entry and starting fees). \$500 to enter and an additional \$500 to start, with \$100,000 guaranteed, of which \$60,000 to the owner of the winner, \$20,000 to second, \$10,000 to third, \$5,000 to fourth, \$3,000 to fifth and \$2,000 to be divided equally among sixth through last. Weights: Three year olds, 117 lbs.; older, 124 lbs. Non-winners of a Grade I or II stakes in 2010 or \$300,000 since November 6, allowed 3 lbs.; \$45,000 in 2010, 6 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box by the usual time of closing. A gold julep cup will be presented to the owner of the winner. Closed March 31, 2010 with 18 nominations. In the event that this race is taken off the turf it will be contested at Six Furlongs on the main track.

SILVER TIMBER vied for the lead between rivals, dropped back a bit on the turn, angled out with a furlong to go and came again late. GRAND ADVENTURE forwardly placed three wide, was bumped approaching the turn when CHAMBERLAIN BRIDGE angled out, made a run at the leader late on the turn, dropped back a bit into the stretch, came again and challenged inside the final furlong, gained a short lead nearing the sixteenth marker but was outfinished. MORALIST vied for the lead along the inside, took over on the turn, responded willingly when challenged by the runner up on the turn, edged off a bit into the stretch, led nearly to the final sixteenth and tired. CHAMBERLAIN BRIDGE close up inside, angled out and bumped the runner up approaching the turn, angled out approaching the stretch for a clear path but lodged only a mild late bid. FREE BRAVE outrun for three furlongs, came three wide into the stretch and made a late gain. A STEEL TRAP was no threat.
