STAKES Coolmore Lexington S. Grade 2 - Thoroughbred

FOR THREE YEAR OLDS. By subscription of \$250 each, which should accompany the nomination; \$3,250 to enter and start with \$325,000 guaranteed, of which \$201,500 to the owner of the winner, \$65,000 to second, \$32,500 to third, \$16,250 to fourth and \$9,750 to fifth. Weight: 123 lbs. Non-winners of \$60,000 twice at a mile or over allowed, 3 lbs.; \$45,000 twice at a mile or over, 5 lbs.; \$30,000 twice at a mile or over, 7 lbs. The maximum number of starters for the Coolmore Lexington will be limited to fourteen. In the event that more than fourteen pass the entry box, the fourteen starters will be determined at that time with preference given to graded stakes winners, then those that have accumulated the highest earnings. Starters to be named through the entry box by the usual time of closing. A gold julep cup will be presented to the owner of the winner. Closed Wednesday, April 7, 2004 with 51 nominations.



QUINTONS GOLD RUSH worked his way in soon after the start to press front-running DASHBOARD DRUMMER under light restraint four wide, inched to

challenge early on the second turn, took over just prior to going six furlongs, settled into the stretch with a clear lead, then continued under solid right-handed encouragement to maintain his advantage. FIRE SLAM, nicely positioned under light rating while between foes three or four wide, moved a bit wider concluding the second turn, loomed prominently outside the winner through the drive and wasn't good enough. SONG OF THE SWORD bobbled at the start, was caught in close quarters soon after when TIGER HEART came out and GAMBLIN was forced in, settled near the inside, reached easy striking distance midway on the backstretch, saved ground while advancing approaching the stretch, angled three wide in the upper stretch, was inside the top two for the final sixteenth and couldn't muster the needed response. POMEROY leaned in at the start bumping GAMBLIN, forced that one in on SONG OF THE SWORD, raced within easy striking distance three or four wide, remained prominent to the stretch and flattened out. DASHBOARD DRUMMER gained the lead early, maneuvered near the inside, showed the way for nearly six furlongs and weakened gradually. EL PRADO ROB, outrun early, angled near the inside approaching the first turn, remained three wide while edging closer around the far turn, came out five or six wide for the drive but was empty. SARATOGA COUNTY, seven wide early, angled in to race between foes five wide, made a mild move to reach contention just before going six furlongs but failed to continue. TOTALLY PLATINUM lightly bumped the gate at the start, quickly angled in four wide and never was a serious factor. TIGER HEART came out at the start putting SONG OF THE SWORD in tight quarters while bumping him, appeared to be climbing a bit while racing inside into the first turn, moved out four wide on the backstretch and failed to menace. GAMBLIN, bumped at the start by POMEROY and forced in, raced in behind rivals and was through after six furlongs. BRIDE'S BEST BOY edged in to track the pace four or five wide, was asked for his best three furlongs out and couldn't keep pace. SUAVE, ridden away from the gate, was steadied behind horses entering the first turn and never was prominent. RACE FOR GLORY was outrun. BOOMZEEBOOM faded after a half.
