BROKEN VOW drifted in soon after the start and bumped with PERFECT CAT, gained the lead, went along under careful rating, turned back challenges from ECTON PARK midway on the backstretch and again on the second turn, drew clear under a mild hand ride at midstretch, then was taken in hand late as much the best. PERFECT CAT broke awkwardly and was bumped soon after by the winner, settled inside, made a run from the rail to reach easy striking distance entering the stretch, angled outside the winner but couldn't muster a closing threat as second best. JADADA, unhurried early and four wide much of the way, made a run from that position on the track to loom prominently for the last eighth but was empty thereafter. ECTON PARK broke a bit in the air, went up soon after to press the winner, challenge midway on the backstretch gaining near even terms, bid again on the second turn but weakened entering the stretch. A FLEETS DANCER saved ground from early on, faded on the second turn and wasn't persevered with.
