Footnotes

GREAT HUNTER, never far back while near the inside, was steadied behind FRENCH TRANSITION entering the far turn, was put to a drive soon after when maneuvered four or five wide, came out bumping twice with CIRCULAR QUAY approaching the stretch forcing that one into PASSPORT, took over from front-running STREET SENSE about the sixteenth pole and drove clear late under energetic handling. CIRCULAR QUAY settled inside early, lost position concluding the backstretch, was asked for more entering the far turn when angled five wide, was bumped twice by the winner nearing the stretch and forced out on PASSPORT, then continued off the inside and gamely earned the place. STREET SENSE, unhurried early, made a bold run four wide on the far turn, took over nearing the stretch, briefly was clear, then weakened in the final sixteenth. BIRDBIRDISTHEWORD, reserved within striking distance early, worked his way forward between rivals on the far turn, moved menacingly to the rail for the drive but flattened out. PASSPORT, sluggish to begin and outrun to the far turn, rallied six or seven wide, was bumped twice nearing the stretch by CIRCULAR QUAY when that one was forced out, then failed to gain in the final furlong. BOLD START tracked the dueling leaders three or four wide, gained even terms for the lead nearing the stretch but weakened soon after being straightened for the drive. TEUFLESBERG chased front-running FRENCH TRANSITION from the beginning, moved to challenge that one upon going a half, gained the advantage on the far turn, briefly was clear but tired approaching the stretch. FRENCH TRANSITION moved to the fore early near the inside, was clear on the first turn, made the pace to the end of the backstretch and faded soon after.
