STAKES Phoenix Breeders' Cup S. Grade 3 - Thoroughbred

FOR THREE YEAR OLDS AND UPWARD. By subscription of \$250 each, which should accompany the nomination; \$750 to enter and an additional \$750 to start, with \$150,000 guaranteed, and an additional \$100,000 from Breeders' Cup for Cup eligibles only. Keeneland Association added monies and all fees to be divided 62% to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth and 3% to fifth. Breeders' Cup fund monies also correspondingly divided providing a Breeders' Cup nominee has finished in an awarded position. Any Breeders' Cup monies not awarded will revert back to the fund. Weight: Three-year-olds, 122 lbs.; Older, 124 lbs. Non-winners of a Grade I or II in 2004 allowed 2 lbs.; Grade III or \$60,000 twice in 2004, 4 lbs; \$45,000 twice in 2004, 6 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box by usual time of closing. A gold julep cup and a Breeders' Cup trophy will be presented to the owner of the winner. Closed Wednesday, September 29, 2004 with 19 nominations.




Footnotes

CHAMPALI, well placed from the beginning while following the dueling leaders four or five wide, reached the front leaving the sixteenth pole while continuing five wide and was hard ridden the remainder. GOLD STORM, hustled along the inside early to contest the pace, gained the advantage on the turn, made the pace into deep stretch and couldn't contain CHAMPALI'S surge. CLOCK STOPPER, outsprinted early and six wide, edged in on the turn, advanced from between rivals into the stretch, briefly lacked room at the furlong grounds, worked his way out seven wide in the late going but couldn't muster the needed response. SUPER FUSE, outrun for a half, rallied from between horses five wide into the lane, angled to the rail at the sixteenth pole and offered a minor

gain to dead heat with WILDCAT HEIR for fourth position. WILDCAT HEIR, forwardly placed between foes three or four wide into the stretch, loomed boldly for the last eighth but came up empty while finishing evenly with SUPER FUSE for fourth. COACH JIMI LEE, between foes four or five wide, wide, flattened out when the test came. PRIVATE HORDE, outsprinted early, raced near the inside, eased out five wide leaving the eighth pole but lacked a rally. ARBITRATE failed to menace. CANADIAN FRONTIER, in a striking position to the stretch while three or four wide, weakened thereafter. DEER LAKE followed the leaders five or six wide to the stretch and tired. HOSCO, sent to the fore early while three or four wide, lost the edge to GOLD STORM on the turn, continued forwardly for a half and tired.
