Footnotes

DESERT GOLD bobbed slightly at the start and came out bumping lightly with GENERAL JEANNE, vied for the lead outside of IN THE LEA under light rating, took over on the far turn, edged clear into the stretch and increased her advantage under hand urging. IN THE LEA gained a slight edge inside early, dueled with the winner, lost the advantage to DESERT GOLD on the far turn, lost position, then dug in through the late stages while continuing inside to save second. UNSURPASSED, unhurried three wide early, moved out five wide on the backstretch, continued off the inside approaching the stretch but couldn't offer a closing account. GENERAL JEANNE, bumped lightly at the break, stalked the pace four wide, was between rivals on the backstretch, was asked for her best three furlongs out and flattened out when straightened for the drive. V V S FLAWLESS, checked in behind rivals entering the first turn, made a run from between horses to reach easy striking distance nearing the stretch, angled inside for the drive but came up empty. CHAP UP, never far back but four or five wide throughout, was put to a drive after six furlongs and faltered in the drive. WEALTHY BELONGINGS moved in behind foes on the first turn, raced in contention four wide for six furlongs and weakened thereafter.
