Weight: 123 lbs. Non-winners of a graded or group stakes on the turf allowed 3 lbs.; a sweepstakes at a mile or over, 6 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box by the usual time of closing. A set of four silver julep cups will be presented to the owner of the winner. Closed Wednesday, October 5, 2005 with 22 nominations. In the event that this race is taken off the turf it will be contested at Eight and One Half Furlongs on the main track.

T. D. VANCE gained the lead early, raced four or five wide in hand, shook off a challenge from TAKE A SHOT on the far turn, drifted out for a stride at the furlong grounds when roused left-handed, then gamely held sway under strong handling. REY DE CAFE, unhurried early, commenced a sweeping rally five wide on the far turn, came out six or seven wide into the stretch and was going well at the end. THERECOMESATIGER stalked the pace four or five wide, lost a bit of position on the far turn, came again with a serious run five wide into the final furlong but wasn't good enough. DRUM MAJOR, never far back and four or five wide, edged closer between foes on the far turn, maneuvered inside for the drive but came up empty. CLASSIC CAMPAIGN, steadied behind horse's heels nearing the first turn, was unhurried, reached contention three or four wide in the upper stretch but lacked a further account. FISHY ADVICE gained a forward position early while working his way in behind the leaders, continued within easy striking distance into the lane and flattened out. BROADWAY IDOL settled near the inside and failed to menace. TAKE A SHOT went up early to press T. D. VANCE four or five wide, was asked for his best a quarter-mile out and tired.
