KATZ ME IF YOU CAN, never far back while lightly rated and stalking the dueling leaders four wide, moved from that position to reach the front nearing the final furlong and was hard ridden to increase her advantage in the late stages. HURRICANE BERTIE bobbed at the start while breaking awkwardly, gained a slight edge while moving inside, was headed a quarter-mile out by MY ALIBI, then held on stubbornly the remainder. MY ALIBI went up early to vie for the lead outside of HURRICANE BERTIE, headed that one a quarter-mile out, then failed to sustain the needed momentum. BOURBON BELLE, bumped at the start and forced out, saved ground within easy striking distance but failed to rally. CINEMINE stumbled at the start and swerved out bumping BOURBON BELLE, forced the pace until midway of the turn and tired. LITTLE ITCH, bumped and steadied in tight quarters at the start, was outrun.
