Footnotes

MIDWAY ROAD, well placed from early on, was rated in behind horses into the backstretch, eased out four wide, advanced steadily four wide nearing the stretch, reached the front at the furlong grounds and was kept to his task the remainder. BHAM vied for the lead soon after the start while between rivals, gained a clear lead approaching the first turn, raced two or three wide from the backstretch on, lost the edge the winner a furlong out and continued on as clearly superior to the rest. UNLEASH THE POWER stalked the pace three or four wide from the beginning, was with the winner while inside that one on the far turn but couldn't keep pace in the drive. NOTHING TO LOSE, four or five wide throughout and within easy striking distance for six furlongs, held his position the remainder but couldn't menace. INDY THUNDER, close up inside from the outset, angled four or five wide entering the lane but was empty. LE JESTER settled inside, raced in contention for six furlongs and was empty entering the stretch. WORKER MAN raced four wide but never reached serious contention. WENDLAR, sluggish early, never was prominent while four or five wide most of the way. DADDY SAYS NO, between foes into the backstretch, gave way upon going a half.
