**Footnotes**

EXCELLERANT, never far back, advanced four or five wide, took over in the upper stretch and was hard ridden the remainder. DIXIE DREAMER, outrun for a half, worked her way out six wide for the drive and was going well at the end. BRILLIANT STAR, never far back and racing near the inside between rivals, angled to the rail in the final furlong and finished willingly. SEEINSBELIEVEN, up close inside early, was steadied in tight leaving the seven-sixteenths pole, swung out seven wide entering the stretch, remained a threat into the final furlong but lacked the needed response. LIVIA B QUICK raced within striking distance while between rivals four wide most of the way and was empty when the test came. TOUCH ME ONCE angled in early to force the issue three abreast, battled forwardly to the stretch and tired. SUMMER ROMANCE, outrun for a half, and five wide, moved eight or nine wide into the lane and never fired. RUBY'S PRIZE gained a slight edge early, dueled outside of SEEINSBELIEVEN, was joined on the turn from the outside by TOUCH ME ONCE, held on well into the upper stretch and weakened. LADY WRANGLER, well placed four or five wide for a half, weakened thereafter. WITTEN, sluggish to start, was always outrun. VOTE EARLY raced near the inside and tired approaching the stretch.
