Footnotes

COSINE, away in good order, moved out to press pacesetting CAJUN CLIFF from the outside, headed that one approaching the final furlong and was under urging to increase his advantage. CAJUN CLIFF gained the lead early, edged inside, lost the advantage to the winner at the furlong grounds and held on stubbornly the remainder. YOUR HERO, outrun early, reached contention between foes upon going a half, angled five wide into the stretch, then, despite attempting to lug in the final furlong, finished willingly. DE HERO, forced to steady at the start and taken up, moved inside, saved ground, loomed menacingly but flattened out the last eighth. ANTIDOTE, wearing a nasal strip, was well placed for a half, came out four or five wide for the drive but flattened out when the test came. DAVESDAY bore in sharply at the start, was outrun for a half and not a threat while improving position. EASY GOING MIRACLE tired upon going a half. DYNAMITE RED wasn't a factor in an even trip. ADMIRABLE failed to menace. TIME TO RIDE was done early. MR. BOLD STORM swerved in while breaking slowly and was outrun.
