Footnotes

REGAL EMPIRE back off the pace while racing out in the course, came four wide and between rivals out of the turn, set down for the drive, closed resolutely while remaining well out in the course to be up at the wire. COUNTRY SAINT lacked early speed after being bothered slightly at the start, moved up to race in the second group while between rivals into the turn, rallied three wide out of the turn, outside bid late, led, nipped at wire. TRUETT'S REBEL behind the leaders while inside, saved ground through the turn, roused into the lane, lacked a significant late response. EL GRAN DR. DAVE dueled up front while closest to the inside, disposed of the other speed to garner a larger advantage nearing the furlong grounds, faltered when confronted late. LOGAN HALL fell back to trail, continued well back through the turn, picked off a couple of tiring rivals after the issue had been decided. FRANS LUCKY ONE broke to the inside, quickly straightened to move up and duel off the inside, gave way in the drive. HAY DUDE forwardly placed early outside the leaders, was tiring when floated out five wide into the straight, continued to fade to the wire.
