LITTLE MISS FLURRY broke alertly, cleared to the inside, rated up the backstretch, held sway in the drive under steady handling. QUESTLIE pressured the winner from the outside throughout, proved stubborn to the end. PRETTY SUSPECT raced off the pace and the inside, set down for the drive, drifted stretch, no match for the top two in the late going. IVY JO lacked speed, angled out midstretch, improved slightly while not having enough in the final strides for the show. OPPOSITE DAY back off the pace for a half, dropped to the inside nearing midstretch, displayed a modest amount of late interest up the rail. HUGGINS AND KISSIN chased the top two for four furlongs and tired. SEEING DESTINY off slowly, moved out while trailing, wide, no rally. AUNT NEANIE always outrun.
