CHIEF THREE SOX came in at the start, prompted the pace three wide under restraint, put the other speed away entering the stretch and stayed clear under firm handling. VILAXY moved into a striking position in the second turn, came four wide into the stretch and finished willingly to be slowly getting to the winner. DEER CREEK lacked early foot, advanced through traffic turning for home and also was going well late. ONE BRICK SHY trailed early, waited briefly when moving closer late in the second turn and continued to improve his position in the drive. ZUPPARDO'S SILK, bothered at the start, recovered and got clear early, vied into and through the second turn and gave way. HE'S GONE COUNTRY lacked a rally. ONE MEAN MAN waited for room inside of traffic a quarter out. NEDLOG was five wide into the stretch. OUR TOWN set or forced the pace for three quarters and stopped. PANCHO PETE failed to menace. GOLDEN ILE had a wide trip.
