KAREN'S STAR pressed the leader for six furlongs, put a head in front turning for home, lost the advantage a furlong out, came back in a game effort. SOPHIE within striking distance inside, waited briefly then moved outside turning for home, challenged and gained the advantage past the furlong marker, outfinished. PHILANTHA well back for six furlongs, saved ground into the stretch, lodged a mild rally up the rail to be along for the show. HUMBLE DOT settled well off the pace, lacked a serious rally. PANCHO'S AFFAIR stumbled at the start, recovered to race forwardly and outside first turn, faded stretch. SPICED set the pace for just over six furlongs and gave way when headed by the winner. JO MARY never menaced.
