Footnotes

SIR MAGIC MAN vied from outside rivals to the turn, rallied back after losing some ground nearing the stretch, lugged in briefly deep stretch but continued to collar FORGOT THE TIME in the closing yards and be edging clear. FORGOT THE TIME contested the lead from along the inside to the turn, came out from the rail a bit into the lane while edging clear then could not contain the winner's late run. TWICE AS BAD was shuffled back between rivals at the start, moved along the inside then awaited room in traffic nearing the stretch, continued along the inside and made a mild run. FIRST CLASS BRASS was three and four wide through the turn into the lane and closed late but could not threaten. MINING GOLD came out racing onto the main track while just off the leaders, remained in reach to upper stretch and weakened. SEASIDE LINKS was packed out by a rival racing onto the main track, remained outside and could not threaten. FUNFORALL showed the most speed racing out from the rail to vie from inside rivals then weakened while drifting out nearing the lane. TURKEY HUNTER lunged at the break to come away slowly and never threatened. ANEJO showed early speed from outside the lead pack and tired.
