TALENTED PLAYER staked the pace, saved ground throughout and just got up in his final strides under all out pressure. MOVIN THE CHAINS dueled for the lead, raced towards the inside throughout and just missed in a game effort. SAMMY WILL TELL pressed the pace while racing between rivals and weakened a bit in the drive. MACHUPECHI was hustled along from the outside, raced three deep into the upper stretch and weakened a bit in the final stages. SUNDAY COACH raced four wide into the upper stretch and never was a factor. ROSS angled to the inside soon after the start, saved ground throughout and never menaced. INVISIBLE EDGE raced towards the inside and never was a factor. LAUNCH RAGAN was slow early and never menaced. TURBO TIGER showed little.
