SMITH B QUICK set all the pace and held gamely to be clear under all out pressure. TIME TO ROAR pressed the pace from the inside and finished second best. TELLIN ON YOU was allowed to settle early, moved up three wide at the eighth pole and made a mild late gain. MR. CLARK was unhurried early, raced towards the inside and never was a serious threat. PAPPA GRANDE was unhurried early, lacked room at the quarter pole and remained back throughout. DICE was slow early, raced in tight quarters at the nine sixteenths pole, raced six wide into the upper stretch and never menaced. DEFENDER'S WORD stalked the pace, was in tight entering the first turn, raced three deep and never was a factor. RIDGE JUMPER was forced to take up briefly around the first turn and never menaced. NITAK was hustled from the inside, clipped heels at the nine sixteenths pole, raced four wide down the backstretch and faded in the final stages.
