TWO TIMES A LADY raced close up under rating, awaited room near the three furlong marker, angled four wide mid way on the turn, closed nicely, took a short lead a sixteenth out then edged clear under a drive. PHYXIUS prompted the pace four wide down the backstretch, lodged a three wide bid three furlongs out, drew clear in upper stretch, was collared leaving the eighth pole then gave way grudgingly. NOTE TAKER saved ground, moved closer on the turn, angled out in midstretch, finished willingly and earned the show. MAISONETTE was away slowly after breaking a bit in the air, circled four wide into the lane then lacked the needed response. THE WORLD OWES ME disputed the pace along the inside and weakened in mid stretch. STEALING THE CANDY was outrun. OLYMPIC NIGHT vied between rivals for four and half furlongs then tired.
