Footnotes

HARD FACTS broke inward and bumped soundly with HE CAN RUN, recovered and prompted the pace four wide under rating, responded when asked five wide approaching the stretch, forged to command under left handed pressure nearing the furlong pole, widened the advantage a sixteenth out and held firm while kept to task. HOLIDAY PROMISE , jostled between rivals at the break, was rated back off the pace and removed from the inside, angled five wide leaving mid turn, was under stiff pressure entering the lane and chased the winner home in willing fashion. HE CAN RUN , bumped hard at the break, set the early pace three wide, eased back off UNBRIDLED PUNCH nearing the five eighths pole, re-bid four wide to take a slim lead between rivals nearing the lane, was overtaken soon after then gave way grudgingly the final furlong. THE CALLER , off slowly, recovered to gradually move up to contention along the rail after a half mile, sat patiently mid turn, shot through along the inside to open a clear lead after six furlongs, was overtaken near the three sixteenths pole, held well to the sixteenth marker then faded. MORE REUBENS bore out at the break causing a jam up, was taken back to rate off the rail, edged up mid turn, dropped in and made a slight rail move in upper stretch then flattened out. YES HE DID stalked the pace between rivals, lodged a three wide bid between foes to dispute the issue nearing the stretch then weakened in the final furlong. UNBRIDLED PUNCH moved up along the inside to take command leaving the three quarter pole, edged clear five furlongs out, set a moderate pace, dueled inside rivals approaching the stretch then tired.
