PENTAKATO lost ground both turns and flattened out. JOHN U TO BERRY raced 3-wide down the backstretch and lacked a serious rally. SIXTY MINUTES saved ground and was never a factor. FINE RAGS was outrun and raced wide most of the trip. TECHNICIAN unhurried early, hard used on rail backstretch and tired.
