SIEGFRIED settled early while saving ground, edged closer under rating after four and a half furlongs, worked outward leaving the three eighths pole, rallied four wide to command leaving the three sixteenths marker, responded to right handed pressure to kick clear then was only under moderate hand coaxing the final sixteenth. SENOR QUICKIE , unhurried early, angled out in upper stretch, moved between rivals with a furlong to go, shifted out wider and finished willingly though no match for the winner. EASTON JACK stalked the pace three wide, was nudged along leaving the five eighths pole, bid to challenge leaving the far turn, dueled, drifted out some nearing the lane then weakened in the final sixteenth. JAZZ AGE , in range off the rail, moved menacingly mid way on the final turn, was floated out five wide upon entering the stretch and failed to kick on the final three sixteenths. GYPSY BARON prompted the pace two wide, bid after a half, dueled on a short lead past the five sixteenths marker then faltered in upper stretch. STRONG SHAFT sprinted clear early, set a slow pace inside, was collared nearing the far turn, gave little resistance and tired. MCNAIR AND ADGER , wide, gave way.
