Footnotes

E. Z. PATH cruised up three wide under rating to take command after a quarter mile, kicked clear early turn, continued removed from the rail entering the stretch, drifted out despite right handed pressure in mid stretch, had his rider switch to the left stick inside the sixteenth marker and held firm. I. TURNER settled off the rail while within range, gathered momentum five wide leaving the three eighths pole, sustained his wide run nearing mid stretch, was floated out a bit and finished gamely. SILVER SLUGGER, off slowly after hopping at the break, came under pressure around the turn while three wide and closed willingly inside rivals. THE A. TRAIN held the early lead inside, was overtaken a half mile out chased the winner around the turn and into the lane, held well to mid stretch then faded. PLEASE SIR, unprepared at the break, came away slowly and bobbed, quickly pulled his way to contention, tracked around the turn while four wide, remained a forward presence to mid stretch then gave way. COTTON BROOK ROAD stalked the early pace two wide, was under a drive between rivals mid turn, stayed in contention to upper stretch then weakened.
