VEER set a pressured pace inside, dueled leaving the far turn, inherited a clear lead leaving the three eighths pole when TAKE THE BLUFF broke down, responded to stout left handed pressure in the lane and held sway. CINDER CONE, taken to rate while saving ground, advanced into the lane, eased out past the eighth pole and finished gamely. DAZZLING SUCCESS pressed the pace between rivals around the first turn, was rated back a bit leaving the five eighths pole to stalk the issue, made a mild move towards the winner mid way on the final turn then weakened in the final furlong. AWESOME JOE, three wide in a forward position, moved a bit closer nearing the far turn, altered out wider to avoid TAKE THE BLUFF leaving the three eighths pole and dropped back. CLASSICAL MASTER failed to menace. TAKE THE BLUFF prompted the pace three wide, moved to near even terms mid way down the backstretch, dueled outside the winner leaving the far turn then broke down approaching the five sixteenths pole.
