PROUD EXPECTATIONS was urged along while off the pace, shifted three midway through the turn, swung five wide near the three-sixteenths pole, rallied into the final furlong and closed strongly to win going away. FLYING NOWHERE chased the pace, raced three wide on the turn, made a bid entering the final furlong, held a narrow lead passing the sixteenth-pole but was overtaken. ALOHA HANK dueled on the outside, inched clear near the quarter-pole, battled determinedly in the stretch and gave way grudgingly. MR. ED G was void of speed, raced three wide on the turn and improved position. HASTY PANCHO broke outward at the start, was ridden along towards the front and came up empty. OSO PARDO was ridden along on the outside, raced four wide on the turn and tired. SINGLE BLOSSUM jostled with a rival at the start, chased the pace on the inside and also tired. FLYERS REWARD jostled with a rival at the start, raced in the middle of the field and failed to respond. DUCKNDODGIN broke outward at the start, raced three to four wide on the turn,

steadied near the eighth-pole and was no factor. HIJODECRAFTY was hard ridden while off the pace, raced four to five wide on the turn and also failed to respond. WASPY CEE stumbled at the start, raced five then four wide on the turn and never reached contention. IMAGINE A CAT jostled with rivals at the start, dueled on the inside, dropped out near the quarter-pole and stopped. SEKAIICHI was always outrun.
