Footnotes

P K'S PHILLY raced four then three wide on the first turn, settled off the pace, moved closer with a half-mile to run, was urged along while off the rail on the far turn, shifted four wide near the quarter-pole, rallied on the outside, gained the lead near the furlong marker, edged clear shortly thereafter and held under strong urging. SURPRIZED WINNER brushed with a rival at the start, raced three then two wide on the first turn, was well placed behind the leaders, raced inside on the far turn, slipped through along the rail entering the final furlong and finished willingly for the place. DRINK AND A WINK raced five wide early on the first turn then dropped in, settled towards the rear, moved closer while inside on the far turn, moved out in upper stretch and finished willingly for the show. FRENCH THUNDER brushed with a rival at the start, was hustled to the lead, set the pace, lost the lead nearing the furlong marker and gave way. STRIKING BLONDIE raced five then four wide early on the first turn, dropped to three wide by late on that turn, contested the pace on the outside, vied three wide on the far turn and tired. VICTORYVILLE raced six wide early on the first turn then dropped in, settled towards the rear and failed to respond.
