Footnotes

FLATLAND FEVER dueled on the inside of a rival while off the rail, inched clear on the turn, responded well in the stretch and held gamely under good handling. SAINT'S RELIC bumped with a rival at the start, chased the pace, saved ground on the turn, held a good striking position into the final furlong but lacked the needed kick while able to get the place. GLASS MACHINE dueled on the outside, chased three wide on the turn and finished evenly but secured the show. PARKER RUN was ridden along while off the pace, raced off the rail on the turn and lacked the needed kick. WILDCAT was ridden along on the outside, raced three to four wide on the turn, came five wide into the stretch and failed to rally. SHAKE A LAKE was off slow, saved ground at the back of the field and was no factor. CERTAINLY FINE broke inward and bumped with a rival, chased the pace, raced four wide on the turn and tired. (Rail at 0 Feet)
