Footnotes

COWBOY SHOES leaned in at the start and was off slow, moved up while hard ridden, engaged the leaders while four wide on the turn, edged clear outside the furlong marker and prevailed under left hand urging. BORDER TOWN raced up close on the inside, was shuffled back outside the three-eighths pole, moved out in upper stretch and finished willingly while unable to reach the winner. JONES TOO dueled for the early lead, dropped back a bit leaving the backstretch, moved to the rail on the turn, re-engaged the leader passing the five-sixteenths pole, vied into upper stretch and weakened while clear for the show. TINCY bumped with a rival at the start, chased the early pace, raced three wide early on the turn, made a bid between rivals passing the five-sixteenths pole, dropped back in upper stretch, drifted out near the sixteenth-pole and gave way. AL was fractious in the gate then broke slow, raced three wide on the turn, ducked in at the top of the stretch, ducked out near the furlong marker, ducked back in approaching the sixteenth-pole and failed to threaten in an erratic effort. CHOCOLATE ATTACK bumped with a rival at the start, dueled on the outside, vied three wide on the turn and tired. CATAPULT SHOT was beaten for early speed, raced off the rail on the turn, ducked in a bit inside the quarter-pole, steadied at the top of the stretch and never reached contention.
