**Footnotes**

HOLIDAY WEAWE was urged along while off the pace, went three to four wide on the turn, came under a drive in upper stretch, made a bid near the furlong marker and proved best under strong urging. PRACTICE TEE was urged along on the outside, moved up near the half-mile pole, chased three wide on the turn, made a bid at the top of the stretch and was outfinished while able to get the place. PORT OF SEATTLE chased the pace on the outside, raced off the rail on the turn, dropped to the inside near the quarter-pole, made a rail bid entering the final furlong but weakened while able to get the show. WEE BE GONE set the pace, vied off the rail on the turn, battled into the final sixteenth and was also outfinished then missed the show. REXDALE WARRIOR chased the pace, dropped back near the seven-sixteenths pole, went two to three wide on the turn and faltered.
