ROLLED UP led in the early stages, relinquished his advantage while maintaining a forward position on the backstretch run, moved three wide into the stretch, responded and prevailed. FAGEDABOUDIT SAL lagged behind the field in a sluggish fashion, advanced nicely while three wide on the far turn, angled out five wide during the stretch run, finished well and was gradually gaining at the finish. WHO'S THE COWBOY was forwardly placed, disputed the pace up the backstretch, dug in but proved no match for the top pair in the last sixteenth. WILLI VON LOON chased the pace while five wide, moved four wide into the stretch, kept on but lacked the needed kick. CALABRIA BELLA was void of speed and never reached contention. CHARLEY'S DIAMOND prompted the pace for six furlongs and weakened in the stretch. LUNA PARK settled well while saving ground yet never menaced.
