DOMINATING broke alert to a short lead, nursed advantage through the turn, sprinted away under a hand ride in upper stretch, won much the best. SERENE PLACE showed good early speed, loomed off of DOMINATING through the turn, chased the superior rival into the stretch, was clearly no match from the 1/4 pole, continued on fully extended inside to salvage place. CALLINTHETROOPS crowded leaving the starting gate, advanced steadily to contention from the 3/8 pole, angled out 5 wide in upper stretch, finished well under a drive. MISS LONESTAR veered out bumping DIXIE PUNCH at the start, was rushed to the front end pressing DOMINATING into the turn, continued to battle from the rail to the 1/4 pole, wore down in upper stretch dropping off. DIXIE PUNCH bumped hard leaving the gate, hustled to contention entering the turn, circled abreast rivals there loomed to the 1/4 pole, asked for more in upper stretch, weakened under the whip. DIAMOND AND GEM'S was never involved. BAY WINDOW was always outrun. SHERMAN GAL struggled throughout. ANTIQUE CRYSTAL had brief foot racing 4 wide, bore out while giving way soon after entering the turn, was put away into stretch breezing home. SLEWPS GOLDENHOLLY showed nothing.
