TO THE LEFT settled nicely going down the backside, advanced three wide on the bend, collared SOUP OF EARL turning for home, put that rival away inside the furlong marker to win going away under a drive. SOUP OF EARL raced up close from the start, drew even on the bend, moved clear at the quarter pole, headed by the winner upper stretch, ceded grudgingly holding on to second place. CHAPTER TWELVE lacked speed racing in the second flight, moved off the rail mid turn splitting foes, swung five wide upper stretch, put to strong left handed stick and responded nicely picking up the show position. BROKEN POST raced evenly in the second flight, traveled five wide on the turn gaining momentum, raced six to seven wide from upper stretch, was outfinished late vying for a minor award. R H CENTENARIO raced up close down the backside, bid between foes at the quarter pole, swung four wide upper stretch, drifted a bit wider mid stretch while tiring. CUT MAN showed good speed, set a pressured pace along the rail, gave way in upper stretch. FLYING NIGHTMARE pressed for the lead down the backside, battled to the quarter pole running between foes, stopped in upper stretch. JACARDI lacked speed, never factored. MEDUSA was always outrun, raced along the rail from upper stretch, never involved.
