GEE'S MONEY BOY stalked close up through the far turn wresting the lead in the four path inside the three sixteenths pole drawing out under a drive. FISKBURG prompted the pace through the backside shaking off TERLINGUA'S PRINCE to go clear on the far turn, overtaken near the three sixteenths pole proved no match holding place along the rail. KIRGHIZ unhurried early saved ground into upper stretch improving position there with a mild rally in the two path. KISATCHIE RUN tracked then pace through the far turn coming four wide in upper stretch, weakened under a drive. IAM A BILLIONAIRE stalked a soft pace through the far turn then tired in the three path upper stretch. ONE GOLDEN CAT slow early was bumped by KIRGHIZ steadying briefly near the seven sixteenths pole, angled to mid track in upper stretch would labor home. TERLINGUA'S PRINCE prompted the pace for half a mile then gave way on the far turn. LEAR was always outrun.
