SALUTE THE TROOPS sent clear from the gate, moved in hand on an unchallenged lead, cut loose briefly to go well clear in upper stretch, rider looked back outside the 1/16 pole, put away late winning much the best. DUN hustled outside to go close up into the turn, pursued SALUTE THE TROOPS willingly to the 1/4 pole, would prove no match in upper stretch, remained responsive along the inside to secure place. GEORGE S. came away well, chased SALUTE THE TROOPS into the turn, began to drop off the leaders and was put to the whip outside the 1/4 pole, gave even action under stiff urging holding off others. PICCOLLO bumped and jostled between horses at the break, angled to the inside while outrun through the turn, showed some interest under a drive gaining late position. ELAINE'S WOLFER in close bumping PICCOLLO at the break, was outrun through the turn, had even response down the lane. JAZZALAYA dropped back early, was hustled with little improvement on the turn, would play no factor. SIMPLY THE LAW hustled along off the pace, had no rally finishing 5 wide. FUTURE KINGS (IRE) showed little. MINERAL SPRINGS put to an early whip, was rushed in pursuit along the inside to the 1/4 pole, had nothing left at the head of the lane. MY COUSIN ANDY couldn't go with the early pace, folded up soon after entering the turn.
