Footnotes

DUTY ROSTER went unhurried early firing to contention out of the turn, dropped to the rail inside the eighth pole surging past SAMURAI PRINCE to win going away. SAMURAI PRINCE was hustled out engaging FLIP FLOP on pace pressuring inside that one through the turn, working a short lead into upper stretch became no match for a rail running DUTY ROSTER late. FLIP FLOP was sent hard pressing alongside SAMURAI PRINCE as the pair carried the pace through the turn, showed fatigue in upper stretch dropping off from the four path. MANDU GENIUS slow early played no factor. IT'S A EGO THING dropped from contention on the turn. STREATERVILLE was always outrun. U. S. S. GOLIATH raced evenly through the turn giving way in upper stretch. AUTO CITY dipped down after the leaving the gate tossing the rider.
