**Footnotes**

CHILE TEQUILA hustled to the front, set a well rated pace traveling a little off the rail, urged from the quarter pole, held safe under steady handling. STUDIO ONE stalked the winner to the half, bid three wide to a menacing position at the quarter pole, was repulsed by upper stretch, proved a very game second best. BLIND RAGE lacked speed running towards the rear, gained momentum past the quarter pole, angled three wide mid stretch, found best stride and closed willingly. SPICEY DISH rated early tracking the pace traveling four wide to the half, bid on the turn, chased the winner into the lane under a stiff drive, leveled off needing more. FANTASTIC DANCER was outrun for six furlongs, gave action after the fact to improve placing but was no real factor. RAINE OF COURAGE tracked to the half, gave way middle of the second turn, no threat. MERRY GREY was forwardly placed racing up close to the half, dropped off past the quarter pole, used up. UNDENIABLY SILVER unhurried early, mounted bid to hold a menacing position at the quarter pole, failed to sustain move and flattened out mid stretch. SOMETHING SUAVE showed good speed, pressed the winner for the opening half mile, gave way past the quarter pole and stopped mid stretch, spent.
