BULLYBULLYBULLY broke alertly shaking off STAR RATING to go clear on the turn, put to a drive in the three path widened in upper stretch moving out a bit late while holding firm. NELLA'S MANGAS stalked the pace chasing BULLYBULLYBULLY through the turn into upper stretch, no match for the winner there secured place in the four path. SUPRISE ENDING raced evenly in mid pack through the turn, extended at mid track down the stretch gained a bit late. SULLY'S LANDING chased early then dropped off on the turn, racing six wide through the stretch gave an even finish. BEYOND THE OCEAN slow early saved ground gaining position in upper stretch, extending late would hang. STARLITS TOUCH slow early was never a factor moving seven wide through the stretch. STAR RATING broke sharply pressing the early pace, wavered on the turn giving way to upper stretch. TEN GALLON was always outrun.
