**Footnotes**

RASCOE was moved off the rail shortly after the start, rallied mid turn coming four wide to the quarter pole, collared CLEVER EXECUTIVE upper stretch, edged clear mid stretch then dug in late to hold on under a stiff drive. THE BIG STORY rated early, roused near the quarter pole, came five wide top of the stretch, surged nearing the wire missing in a willing effort. FUNKY COUNTRY was never far off the pace, split foes at the quarter pole, loomed off of top pair mid stretch, was outfinished late needing a bit more. CASTLE QUARTER raced mid track in the second flight, bid between foes mid stretch showing belated action, finished with interest but was no real threat. MULTIPHONE lagged to the quarter pole, angled while finding best stride, closed strongly but was no menace. THREEWISEMEN lacked speed running towards the rear, gave some late action improving placing but was no real threat. CLEVER EXECUTIVE pressed the pace traveling three wide down the backside, drew even on the bend, put a head in front at the quarter pole, angled to the rail entering the stretch, battled to mid stretch, faded late, used up. TRIPPIT raced evenly at mid track, failed to respond when asked, no factor. PAPA D vied for the lead going down the backside, dropped off leaving the quarter pole, finished spent. ALCHOLIDAY was hard used vying for the lead shortly after the start, battled to the quarter pole, stopped mid stretch finishing weary.
