Footnotes

KHABIBULIN taken in hand early and trailed to mid turn, swung out four to five wide in upper stretch, surged on TOP MEADOW in deep stretch, arrived in time for the victory under strong handling. TOP MEOW rushed hard to vie for the early lead, raced five wide on the turn abreast rivals, cleared at the quarter pole, angled inside in upper stretch, held a substantial lead with a furlong to go, was under a drive from the sixteenth pole but could not hold off KHABIBULIN in last jumps missing in a solid effort. LEROY'S DEPUTY battled in a four way duel mid turn running between foes, tired in mid stretch saving third place. WHY HE'S ENOUGH lacked early foot traveling off the rail, came five to six wide in upper stretch, showed mild late interest improving placing but never menaced. GLASS AGE hustled leaving the gate, vied for the early lead along the rail, was in tight and checked and steadied going into the far turn losing position and momentum, came again under urging in upper stretch, angled out late for room in deep stretch finishing with interest. JOE'S LAD rushed from the gate vying for the lead running between foes, had enough by upper stretch and gave way. FLASHIN THE BULL battled to the quarter pole running between foes, was all done inside the eighth pole giving way to the finish line.
