Footnotes

CALLING GERI sent clear set the pace on solid splits through the far turn, drew out along the inside in upper stretch then used the cushion while a bit weary late. MARLETTE raced evenly in mid pack to the far turn, picked it up there emerging off a loose CALLING GERI at mid track in upper stretch, ran at the tiring leader late before running out of ground. KIPLING BOY stalked close up through the far turn, moved from the three to the four path in upper stretch giving an even finish under late extension. BERRA ducked out leaving the gate, stalked the pace racing five wide through the backside, pursued on the far turn then weakened in the four path in upper stretch. SPECIALNESS slow early played no factor. MOUNTAIN STORM away slowly was never involved. PADDY TAP saving ground would tire. HOME ALARM showed little. YARDEE done early would lose the rider leaving the far turn.
