

HUNTER DOWN taken back from the gate, went under restraint 4 wide into the backstretch, cut loose near the 3/8 pole, powered up on the outside of hard used pace setters nearing the 1/4 pole, blew clear in upper stretch, won going away. MRS. CHARLES unhurried in second flight, roused with response leaving the backstretch, gained steadily into the stretch, was no match for HUNTER DOWN there, went fully extended abreast CLASSICAL MUSIC to salvage place. CLASSICAL MUSIC well placed off a hurried pace, followed along on the inside to the 1/2 mile pole, responded when asked into final turn, pursued a loose HUNTER DOWN from the 1/4 pole, remained willing missing place. POST OP sent to engage on the early pace, moved alongside OUR GOLDEN GAL down the backside, was continuing that duel when HUNTER DOWN rolled up from the outside, overmatched by that one near the 1/4 pole, was spent in upper stretch. SUDDENLY THRILLED away slowly, struggled well back to the stretch, had minimal improvement there. I ACCEPT raced evenly into the opening turn, had some under asking to the 1/2 mile pole, leveled off on final turn, labored to wire. CITY JITTERS raced evenly while losing ground in second flight, empty inside the 1/4 pole. OUR GOLDEN GAL bumped at the break, rushed up pressing POST OP from the inside to the 1/2 mile pole, extended for more on final turn, wilted at the head of the lane. PALACE DE LADY had a laboring journey. CAT SCRATCH roused to the front end from the gate, lasted into the backside, gave way nearing the 1/2 mile pole, had nothing left when eased late.
