GRAND PIANO MAN stalked a lose leader while saving ground, closed in turning for home, edged clear in mid stretch, was hard ridden coming to the wire holding off a fast finishing THUNDER MINISTER in last jumps. THUNDER MINISTER settled towards the rear running at mid track, came out five wide into the lane, made a powerful surge nearing the wire narrowly missing in a game effort. BACKGAMMON stumbled at the break, recovered and moved out wide down the backstretch, rushed moving into second place going into the far turn, chased under a drive from the quarter pole, loomed in mid stretch the leveled off saving third place. HACHI tracked down the backside, gave chase into the lane traveling four wide, lacked needed surge missing third place. ALL THE GLORY trailed down the backside, angled to the rail on the bend, improved placing late but never menaced. SCORION broke alertly and opened up a clear advantage mid turn, raced in the two path entering the stretch, headed from both sides and began to give way inside the eighth pole, used up. COUNTRY KINGPIN lacked speed racing along the inside, stopped entering the stretch and finished well beaten.
