Footnotes

RICHIE'S REAL DEAL went unchallenged on the lead, moved out to the four path entering the backside, set slow fractions while in hand, moved a bit back down to the rail going into the far turn, came back out to the three path mid turn when threatened by FLAG INDY, turned that rival away top of the lane, drew off having plenty left in the lane, won easily being ridden out. FLAG INDY stalked the winner from the start, made a menacing move at the three eighths, was turned away by the winner by upper stretch, proved second best in a willing effort. EL PATRONE settled towards the rear traveling off the rail, bid mid turn racing four wide, chased top pair in the lane, never threatened holding third place. CENTENNIAL'S SONG rated early, mildly bid entering the stretch running towards the inside, lacked needed surge never threatened. NO ORDINARY GUY stalked the winner running along the rail, began to chase on the turn, lacked rally and faded in the lane. RATHER QUICK made a middle move along the rail at the half, could not keep pace from midway on the second turn, gave way finishing well beaten.
