PERFECT CREVASSE unhurried early circled out to upper stretch responding in the six path to sweep clear late. SHERIFF BULLOCK stalked early pressing up to challenge into the far turn, dueled in the two then three path down the lane ceding to a wide running PERFECT CREVASSE late. SUPREMACY laid close up pressuring three deep near the far turn, dueled in the three then four path upper stretch coming up a bit short between horses. SMOOTH TANGO sent clear worked on pace dueling along the inside on the far turn, ceded in upper stretch dropping off near the rail. TRIPPIN' AWAY stalked the pace staying within range through the far turn, extended in the four path upper stretch would weaken. GRASS BLADE saved ground chasing through the far turn, dropped off along the rail in upper stretch. CHALLENGER gave a prompted middle move chasing through the far turn, wavered in upper stretch fading in the four path. WISE MR. BEAN was always outrun.
