Footnotes

BATTLE MOUNTAIN slow early circled out while beginning to respond on the far turn, bid seven wide in upper stretch angling in to the four path late edging up under extension. COLONEL POTTER slow early stayed back through the far turn, rallied in the three path upper stretch dropping to the two slot while battling to the end. BLUE SOLDIER raced second flight through the far turn, cut the corner to contention as the front end tired in upper stretch, extending along the rail gave an even finish. WAYNE THE TRAIN hustled out would set a quick pace through the far turn, collared between horses in upper stretch gave way in the four path. STREET TALK'N MAN slow early moved up to threaten on the far turn, raced seven wide in upper stretch leveling off late. SURFACTANT tracked the pace drawing closer on the far turn, looming from mid track in upper stretch would flatten out late. EYESFORHUMOR prompted the early pace then wilted after a half mile, was eased through the stretch.
