Footnotes

FATHER'S MIG was patiently ridden in the early going, raced four to five wide around the turn, rallied three wide taking aim on CHARMING ENDEAVOUR in upper stretch, collared that rival inside the eighth pole, drew off late under energetic handling. CHARMING ENDEAVOUR urged shortly after the start, cleared to set the pace running along the inside, maintained a clear lead to mid stretch, was no match in the final sixteenth for FATHER'S MIG but held place in a good effort. ALTA BOY tracked to mid turn, bid three wide at the quarter pole, chased the runner up into the stretch, lacked needed punch and settled for third place. CATRILLION lacked speed and trailed around the bend, roused top of the stretch, surged between foes in deep stretch, improved position but never threatened. PETER THE GROSS settled towards the rear, raced five wide under a drive top of the stretch, failed to respond. MEMORY ROAD pressed briefly for the early lead, stalked around the bend running along the rail, could not keep pace from mid stretch, faded to the wire. STORMY DUDE was hard used vying for the early lead, dropped off running between rivals leaving the quarter pole finishing spent.
