Footnotes

WHY US raced up close to a pair of duelers along the inside, angled out mid turn, quickly gained entering the stretch, drew even with ADMIRED in mid stretch, moved clear and won easily being ridden out. ADMIRED hustled early, set a pressured pace to mid turn, edged away at the quarter pole, was collared by WHY US in upper stretch, proved no match in the final furlong but did hold well for second place. ROSTA unhurried trailing in the early stages while off the rail, rallied upper stretch traveling six wide, showed good late energy picking up the show position in willing manner. BYE BYE HOLLYWOOD settled early, rushed a four wide move at the quarter pole, loomed off of top pair in mid stretch, needed more late being outgamed for third place. WHY IZZY WHY raced towards the rear till the quarter pole, angled out a bit mounting bid in upper stretch, leveled off needing more late. SWEET LIKE SUGAR sent from the gate and dueled with the runner up to mid turn, could not keep pace leaving the quarter pole and tired in mid stretch. POMMETTE raced in mid pack to the quarter pole, gave way running along the rail in upper stretch, no factor.
