Footnotes

GUAM TYPHOON pressured the pace through the turn shaking off DELAUNCY to go clear in upper stretch, angled toward mid track with an eye to ST. MAXIMUS GATO late would dig deep to prevail. ST. MAXIMUS GATO pressed early then was steadied briefly when in tight between horses near the seven sixteenths pole, regrouped out of the turn ranging up in six path hooking GUAM TYPHOON from the outside missing at the wire. MEGA RUSH pressured the early pace being overtaken on the turn, stayed after in the three path down the stretch proving willing to the end. DELAUNAY broke sharply pressuring the pace going in tandem with GUAM TYPHOON through the turn, ceded to rival in upper stretch wearing down in the four then five path. JEMARU slow early circled out six wide in upper stretch proving no menace. RAVALO a step slow early was never involved. WILL'S WILDCAT sluggish from the outset labored. REAL LUCK had brief speed then retreated after being in a bit close near the seven sixteenths pole. An objection from the rider of REAL LUCK against the rider of MEGA RUSH for interference near the seven sixteenths pole was disallowed by the stewards.
