Footnotes

CULOTTE tracked under patient handling through the turn pressing up to challenge in the three path upper stretch, wrested the lead from PLUS ONE then held FLASHY LASSIE at bay in the closing yards. FLASHY LASSIE a step slow early was hard roused on the turn responding near the quarter pole fanning out to mid track in upper stretch, ran at CULOTTE late to no avail. PLUS ONE bobbling at the break still made an easy lead, rated under pressure through the turn led the way along the rail in upper stretch, engaged there would come up a bit short. VENETIAN SONATA squeezed back by PLUS ONE at the break circled out five on the turn then six wide upper stretch responding to finish well. PISKACHA stalked early advancing on the turn looming at mid track in upper stretch, extending from the eighth pole would gradually weaken. EMBRACING HEARTS broke alertly chasing then pressuring the pace through the turn into upper stretch, asked for more in the three path there would wear out. QUEEN TEUTA was always a step slow racing six then eight wide down the stretch. SPRING ECLIPSE was always outrun.
