Footnotes

BLAZING COUNTESS well rated, rallied to split foes mid turn, quickly bid to duel outside of DIAMOND LAUR entering the stretch, received strong left handed stick, drew clear coming to the wire. DIAMOND LAUR set the pace racing off the rail, headed by the winner entering the lane, rider lost whip while switching hands at the three sixteenths, battled gamely along the rail during the stretch run, held place in game effort. THAT'S A SECRET rated early on, rallied to loom running four wide at the quarter pole, chased top pair into the lane, flattened out inside the eighth pole. URBAN SHOCKER well placed early, rushed bid along the rail to vie briefly nearing the half, chased mid turn, weakened mid stretch. BID FOR SILVER reserved early, raced six wide down the backside, mounted a brief bid far turn, weakened leaving the quarter pole, no threat. IMA BENDER BOO hustled and showed brief foot, chased nearing the half, was all done by the quarter pole.
